Christ is the image of the invisible God

Definition of Logos:

In theology (the study of God), the logos is the second member of the Trinity. He is divine reason, He is the immanent power of God, implicit in the cosmos, ordering it and giving it form and meaning.

The Trinity:

The Father, the Logos and the Holy Spirit are not three beings, they are one being. Even though they are one being, they are not identical. All three are of the same essence, yet in some sense, they are distinguishable.

The main thing about the Incarnation of the Logos is that you understand, believe, live in light of, and share with others that the Logos, the Savior of all mankind is Jesus Christ, God in the flesh.

Genuine belief in the scandal of Christ's preexistence, descencion, person, work, purpose, miracles, crucifixion, resurrection, and re-ascension, is what distinguishes every true believer.

The main reason the Logos descended to earth is because we are a fallen and sin ravaged people, where sin is not a series of bad choices, but a helpless state of being from which sinful, evil, and wicked choices continually flow.

Creation itself gives us every reason to believe in an intelligent life force, but since nature sheds no tears for human beings, we could not, until the birth of Jesus Christ, know that the brilliance of the Creator is love. Remembering the Messiah's birth reminds us that God chooses to join us on this curious, broken, blue planet full of angst and wonder.

The main thing about the Logos' arrival into our world in the form of a baby is the revelation that each human being is the result of God's purposeful, creative power. Each of us is willed, each of us is loved, and each of us is necessary. The humble arrival of the Messiah teaches us that everyone's life has great value in and of itself, totally apart from what the world thinks of him or her. God loves us even if no one else does.

When Jesus gave up His glory He deliberately chose to be born in a cave to a poor family, and He made shepherds the first witnesses of His coming. Each year remembering His birth reminds me that my weaknesses and my "status" are unimportant in God's eyes. I do not have to earn His love, only return it.

The main thing about the Incarnation is that Christ is God in the flesh, and as such, He has the power to forgive sins, to heal, to bless, to show mercy, to redeem, and to give eternal life (starting today) by grace thru faith.

The main thing about how we celebrate Christmas is that it reveals our priorities, our affinities, and what it is we hold most dear.

Celebrating the arrival of King Jesus into the world by participating in all the decorating, festivities, gift giving, and caroling of Christmas without knowing, understanding, or keeping the main thing as the main thing, is comparable to straightening chairs on the Titanic.

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
