THE MESSIAH'S MISSION

Luke 2:1-20

At that time the Roman emperor, Augustus, decreed that a census should be taken throughout the Roman Empire.



(This was the first census taken when Quirinius was governor of Syria.)



All returned to their own ancestral towns to register for this census.

And because Joseph was a descendant of King David, he had to go to Bethlehem in Judea, David's ancient home. He traveled there from the village of Nazareth in Galilee.

He took with him Mary, to whom he was engaged, who was now expecting a child.



And while they were there, the time came for her baby to be born.

She gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him snugly in strips of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no lodging available for them.

What day, month, and year does the **Bible say Jesus** was born?

How many birthday parties occur in the **Bible?**

2 Birthdays Genesis 40:20-23 – Pharaoh chops off his chief baker's head during his birthday party. Luke 3:19-20 – King Herod chopped off John the Baptist's head at his step-daughter's request.

According to the Bible, what did Jesus look like?

Isaiah 53:2

My servant grew up in the Lord's presence like a tender green shoot, like a root in dry ground. There was nothing beautiful or majestic about his appearance, nothing to attract us to him.

Isaiah 52:14

But many were amazed when they saw him. His face was so disfigured he seemed hardly human, and from his appearance, one would scarcely know he was a man.

According to the Bible, when did **Christians** celebrate the first Christmas?

Who initiated the celebration of **Christmas?** Why did they do so?

Where in the Bible do we find the Christmas traditions we celebrate such as Christmas trees, egg nog, giving each other presents, mistletoe, reindeer, etc?

So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger.

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem

Matthew 2:2

and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

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What are Some of the Biblical Principles of **Christ's Birth?**

Principle #1 The extremely simple and humble arrival of the Master demonstrates His heart and character regarding what He views as being essential for every human life.

Principle #2

God chose the humblest birth for His entry into the world in order to show us that the central value of life, is a life committed to loving, obeying, and fulfilling the will of the Master.

Our true worth and significance is not based on where we come from, who our family is, how much money we have, our societal status, our successes, or even our mistakes, it is based on who we are in relationship to God.

Principle #3 The ways of the Master are meant to contrast His way of doing things upside down and backwards with the ways of the world, our culture, and even the way we Christians do things.

Principle #4

In the Kingdom of God it is very common for the Master's work to go on quietly and unnoticed in what the world would consider to be hidden and otherwise insignificant people and places.

Principle #5 Those on whom God's favor rests are more often than not ordinary people with ordinary lives who choose to make the most of each day by faithfully and intentionally offering their lives as a living sacrifice to God.

Principle #6

The Messiah's Mission was to come to us, to reveal God to us, to identify with us, to minister to us, to disciple us, to take our sins upon Himself, to die for us, to be raised from the dead for us, to save us, and to be in relationship with us.

Principle #7

While there is much to learn about the ways of the Master thru His arrival into the world; it is His life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection that set Him apart as the one true Master.

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
