2 Corinthians 5:10-21

For we must all stand before Christ to be judged. We will each receive whatever we deserve for the good or evil we have done in this earthly body.

Because we understand our fearful responsibility to the Lord, we work hard to persuade others. God knows we are sincere, and I hope you know this, too.

Either way, Christ's love controls us. Since we believe that Christ died for all, we also believe that we have all died to our old life.

He died for everyone so that those who receive his new life will no longer live for themselves. Instead, they will live for Christ, who died and was raised for them.

This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new creation. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!

And all of this is a gift from God, who brought us back to himself through Christ. And God has given us this task of reconciling people to him.

2 Corinthians 5:19 For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, no longer counting people's sins against them. And he gave us this wonderful message of reconciliation.

So we are Christ's ambassadors; God is making his appeal through us. We speak for Christ when we plead, "Come back to God!"

For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ.

Reconciliation Defined The end of a broken relationship between two parties that results in the restoration of friendly relations.

It is a harmony that is established between enemies through a peace treaty.

Commissioned priests in the Kingdom of God that have been sent by God as His official representative to the lost in a fallen world. Their message is, "Come back to God!" and He will restore you to your rightful place.

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Principle #4 Reconciled people live reconciled lives.

The gospel of Jesus Christ is not our chance to get right with God, instead it is God's declaration that He has already provided the way and means for us to become right with Him.

For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ.

God's unconditional love is revealed most dramatically in the sending of His Son to be a sinless sacrifice for the sins of all people. The cross of Christ meets the ultimate need of all human beings, which is their need for mercy from a righteous God.
