I know that everything God does will endure forever; nothing can be added to it and nothing taken from it. God does it so that people will fear him.


Ecclesiastes 3:15 Whatever is has already been, and what will be has been before; and God will call the past to account.

All of reality (past, present, and future), is not something that is primarily driven by social, political, national, global, or even supernatural forces. It is shaped by God, who acts in accordance with His character to move time along towards His own goals.
