

Deuteronomy 30:11 This command I am giving you today is not too difficult for you, and it is not beyond your reach.

Deuteronomy 30:12 It is not kept in heaven, so distant that you must ask, 'Who will go up to heaven and bring it down so we can hear it and obey?'

Deuteronomy 30:13 It is not kept beyond the sea, so far away that you must ask, 'Who will cross the sea to bring it to us so we can hear it and obey?'

Deuteronomy 30:14 No, the message is very close at hand; it is on your lips and in your heart so that you can obey it.

Deuteronomy 30:15 Now listen! Today I am giving you a choice between life and death, between prosperity and disaster.

Deuteronomy 30:16a For I command you this day to love the Lord your God and to keep his commands, decrees, and regulations by walking in his ways.

Deuteronomy 30:16b If you do this, you will live and multiply, and the Lord your God will bless you and the land you are about to enter and occupy.

Deuteronomy 30:17 But if your heart turns away and you refuse to listen, and if you are drawn away to serve and worship other gods,

Deuteronomy 30:18 then I warn you now that you will certainly be destroyed. You will not live a long, good life in the land you are crossing the Jordan to occupy.

Deuteronomy 30:19a **Today I have given you the choice** between life and death, between blessings and curses. Now I call on heaven and earth to witness the choice you make.

Deuteronomy 30:19b Oh, that you would choose life, so that you and your descendants might live!

Deuteronomy 30:20a You can make this choice by loving the Lord your God, obeying him, and committing yourself firmly to him. He is the key to your life.

Deuteronomy 30:20b And if you love and obey the Lord, you will live long in the land the Lord swore to give your ancestors Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

Principle #2

God gives us choices because the demands of our covenant relationship with God are knowable, reasonable, comprehensible, and possible.

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Principle #3

We are free to choose, but we are not free from the consequences of our choices.

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Our choices reveal faithfulness or faithlessness.

l Kings 18:21b If the Lord is God, follow him! But if Baal is God, then follow him!" But the people were completely silent.

Our choices shape us and change us for better or for worse.

Every time you make a choice you are turning the central part of you, the part of you that chooses, your inner being, into something a little different than it was before.

And if you look at your life as a whole, with all your innumerable choices, whether you realize it or not, you are slowly turning this central thing, your inner being, into a heavenly creature or a hellish creature:

With each choice you are either becoming a heavenly creature that is growing in love and harmony with God, with others, and with yourself, or you are becoming something unholy, that is growing in its rebellion and hatred of God, others, and itself.

It is never too late to stop making foolish or faithless choices.



Take responsibility for your choices by confessing them to God and to those who were affected. **Commit to changing.** Understand you can't change on your own.

Choices made in faith will often demonstrate wisdom and patience as they invest in delayed gratification.
