Joshua 1:18

(the officers of the people are speaking) Anyone who rebels against your (Joshua's) command and does not obey your words in all that you command him, shall be put to death; only be strong and courageous.

Ancient Jericho

Towns became bigger as their populations increased. This made their architecture and urban planning more complex and they required more space to expand. The possibility of storing food surpluses meant that part of the population quit agricultural activities to devote their time to other things. Artisans, priests, traders... The wealth of flourishing cities attracted greed of the nomadic tribes and forced their inhabitants to build protective walls around their cities. This was the case of Jericho, in the West Bank, Palestine. With a history of more than ruleo years, this was the first fortified city known ever and, up to the present day, it is considered the first city in history.

Jericho, the first one

Naturfian humter groups settled in this spot in 12,000 BC before it became the city of Arricho. Towards 9,400 BC, the settlement had more than 70 houses with around a thousand inhubitants and something unprecedented; a 5,5m highand almost am thick wall and a store tower that reached a beight of 8,5 m. 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Principle #1

Asking the right questions will lead to an understanding of God's will, while asking the wrong ones will lead to more confusion and distraction from His will.

Joshua 5:13-14 And Joshua went to him and said to him, "Are you for us or for our adversaries?" He said, "No; rather I indeed come now as captain of the host of the Lord."

Who is this "captain of the host of the Lord" or "commander of the Lord's army"?

Principle #2

Giving God limited options will automatically limit your ability to know and understand God's will.

God is not on your side, He's not on my side. He's only on His side

Joshua 5:13-14 And Joshua went to him and said to him, "Are you for us or for our adversaries?" He said, "No; rather I indeed come now as captain of the host of the Lord."

Daniel 4:35

All the people of the earth are counted as nothing, and He does as He pleases...no one can hold back His hand or say to Him: "What have you done?"

Psalm 115:3 Our God is in heaven and does as He pleases.

Isaiah 43:13

Even from eternity I am He, and none can deliver out of My hand. When I act, who can reverse it?

Principle #3

We must learn how to hold the mystery of God's will just as we hold the mystery of the Trinity or the nature of Christ.

We have free will and every decision is determined by God.

Is Jesus God or man?



Is God sovereign or do we have free will?



Proverbs 16:1 The plans of the heart belong to man, but the answer of the tongue is from the Lord.

Principle #4

We must base our understanding of God's will on the FULL counsel of God's revealed word and not just on selected scriptures or allegiance to one theological interpretation or another.

Does God establish every authority in government or do we choose them?



Romans 13:1

There is no authority except from God, and those which exist are established by God.

Hosea 8:4

They have set up kings, but not by Me; they have appointed princes, but I did not know it. Does your vote matter or is God going to do what He is going to do anyway?



Why even vote, act, or pray if God is going to do what He's going to do anyway?

Because it matters to God.

Because of human logic, we desire answers that are easier to grasp, but this can lead us to making "all or nothing" statements.

Did Joseph's brothers mean for Joseph to suffer in Egypt or did God?

Let's be like the Bereans.

Genesis 50:20 (Joseph speaking) As for you, you meant it for evil against me, but God meant it for good in order to bring about this present result, to preserve many people alive.

We do have a choice: will we be on God's side or not?

Joshua 24:16

Choose for yourselves today whom you will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served which were beyond the river, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living; but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.

Principle #5

Our decisions and motives matter: not because they change our circumstances, but because our choices can change our hearts to be in complete alignment with His.

This should always be our goal.

James 4:13

Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, and spend a year there and engage in business and make a profit."

James 4:14

Yet you do not know what your life will be like tomorrow. You are just a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes away.

James 4:15

Instead, you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and also do this or that."

Romans 12:2

And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect.

Principle #6

Our response to God's revealed will should not be based on whether we agree or like it. **Our response should be the same** as Joshua's: "What does my Lord want to say to **His servant?**

Joshua 5:14

And Joshua fell on his face to the earth, and bowed down, and said to him "What has my lord to say to his servant?"

Matthew 26:39 And He (Jesus) went a little beyond them, and fell on His face and prayed, saying, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; Yet not as I will, but as You will."

Principle #7

Understanding God's will requires humility, humility, and more humility.

It's not about us, it's all about Him.

Joshua 5:14

And Joshua fell on his face to the earth, and bowed down, and said to him "What has my lord to say to his servant?"

Joshua 5:15

The captain of the Lord's host said to Joshua, "Remove your sandals from your feet, for the place where you are standing is holy." And Joshua did so.
