God's Voice Consistently

1 Samuel 3:1

Meanwhile, the boy Samuel served the Lord by assisting Eli. Now in those days messages from the Lord were very rare, and visions were quite uncommon.

l Samuel 3:2

One night Eli, whose eyes were becoming so weak that he could barely see, was lying down in his usual place.

1 Samuel 3:3

The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the house of the Lord, where the ark of God was.

1 Samuel 3:4 Then the Lord called Samuel. Samuel answered, "Here I am."

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And he ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. Did you call me?"

But Eli said, "I did not call; go back and lie down." So he went and lay down.

1 Samuel 3:6 Again the Lord called, "Samuel." And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am. Did you call me?"

"My son," Eli said, "I did not call; go back and lie down."

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Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord: The word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him.

1 Samuel 3:8 A third time the Lord called, "Samuel." And Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "Here I am. Did you call me?"

Then Eli realized that the Lord was calling the boy.

1 Samuel 3:9 So Eli told Samuel, "Go and lie down, and if he calls you, say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

1 Samuel 3:10 The Lord came and stood there, calling as at the other times, "Samuel. Samuel."

Then Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

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The Lord was with Samuel as he grew up, and he let none of Samuel's words fall to the ground.

1 Samuel 3:20 And all Israel from Dan to **Beersheba recognized that** Samuel was attested as a prophet of the Lord.

1 Samuel 3:21 The Lord continued to appear at Shiloh, and there he revealed himself to Samuel through his word.

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The Voice of God

A specific communication from God directly to you, that is clearly distinguishable from your own inner voice. It comes in many ways, shapes, or forms. God's voice is heard Spirit to spirit so it can be hard to quantify at times.

Backstory of 1 Samuel 3

- The time frame is during the end of the time of Judges, where "all the people did what was right in their own eyes".
 - At that time messages from the Lord were rare because most of Israel was not focusing on listening to God.

Backstory of 1 Samuel 3

- Eli the priest's sons were extremely wicked and corrupt.
- They focused on satisfying their selfish desires, which is why I believe that visions from the Lord were quite uncommon.
- Samuel is Hannah's son who was given to the Lord as a child.

Principle #1

Although many who faithfully serve the Lord have a hard time personally hearing God's voice, it is not because the Lord is failing to speak on a consistent basis.

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Meanwhile, the boy Samuel served the Lord by assisting Eli. Now in those days messages from the Lord were very rare, and visions were quite uncommon.

Were messages from the Lord rare because God wasn't speaking? Or because most people were **not listening?**

1 Samuel 2:12 Now the sons of Eli were scoundrels who had no respect for the Lord or for their duties as priests.

1 Samuel 2:22 Now Eli was very old, but he was aware of what his sons were doing to the people of Israel. He knew, for instance, that his sons were seducing the young women who assisted at the entrance of the Tabernacle.

1 Samuel 2:23 Eli said to them, "I have been hearing reports from all the people about the wicked things you are doing. Why do you keep sinning?

1 Samuel 2:24 You must stop, my sons! The reports I hear among the Lord's people are not good.

1 Samuel 2:25a If someone sins against another person, God can mediate for the guilty party. But if someone sins against the Lord, who can intercede?"

l Samuel 2:25b But Eli's sons wouldn't listen to their father, for the Lord was already planning to put them to death.

 $1 \operatorname{Samuel} 2:27$ One day a man of God came to Eli and gave him this message from the Lord: "I revealed myself to your ancestors when they were Pharaoh's slaves in Egypt.
1 Samuel 2:28

I chose your ancestor Aaron from among all the tribes of Israel to be my priest, to offer sacrifices on my altar, to burn incense, and to wear the priestly vest as he served me. And I assigned the sacrificial offerings to you priests.

1 Samuel 2:29 So why do you scorn my sacrifices and offerings? Why do you give your sons more honor than you give me—for you and they have become fat from the best offerings of my people Israel!"

1 Samuel 2:30 Therefore, the Lord, the God of Israel, says: "I promised that your branch of the tribe of Levi would always be my priests. But I will honor those who honor me, and I will despise those who think lightly of me.

1 Samuel 2:31 The time is coming when I will put an end to your family, so it will no longer serve as my priests. All the members of your family will die before their time. None will reach old age.

1 Samuel 2:32You will watch with envy as I pour out prosperity on the people of Israel. But no members of your family will ever live out their days.

1 Samuel 2:33 The few not cut off from serving at my altar will survive, but only so their eyes can go blind and their hearts break, and their children will die a violent death.

1 Samuel 2:34 And to prove that what I have said will come true, I will cause your two sons, Hophni and Phinehas, to die on the same day!

1 Samuel 2:35 Then I will raise up a faithful priest who will serve me and do what I desire. I will establish his family, and they will be priests to my anointed kings forever.

1 Samuel 2:36 Then all of your surviving family will bow before him, begging for money and food. 'Please,' they will say, 'give us jobs among the priests so we will have enough to eat."

Although many who faithfully serve the Lord have a hard time personally hearing God's voice, it is not because the Lord is failing to speak on a consistent basis.

All genuine believers in the Lord can and do hear the voice of God; but way too often, we fail to consistently discern when we are hearing God's voice.

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Why Do We Fail to Hear?

- We are misinformed theologically:
 - Do you believe that God still speaks today?
 - Do you believe that God wants to specifically speak to you?
 - Do you understand that you have a responsibility to invest in hearing His voice?

Why Do We Fail to Hear?

- It takes time, effort, and focus.
 - We are simply too busy.
 - We don't practice quietness,
 stillness and listening.
 - We've deafened ourselves to our Master's voice.
 - Because the voice of our desires is louder than His voice.

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There can be no personal, intimate relationship with our heavenly Father, if we do not hear Him speak to us personally.

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The Voice of God

A specific communication from God directly to you, that is clearly distinguishable from your own inner voice. It comes in many ways, shapes or forms. God's voice is heard Spirit to spirit so it can be hard to quantify at times.

Christian parentage and religious instruction will lead to intimately knowing the Lord only if one invests in hearing God personally.

John 10:25 Jesus replied, "I have already told you, and you don't believe me. The proof is the work I do in my Father's name.

John 10:26 But you don't believe me because you are not my sheep.

John 10:27 My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me.

John 10:28 I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one can snatch them away from me,

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Being able to hear God personally usually requires a spiritual mentor to help you discern the voice of God.

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When God personally speaks to you, you won't always love the message, but it will always match His written word, it will be received by wise, godly people, it will always come to fruition, and it will always honor and glorify Him.
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
