God's Unique Will For You Is As Unique As You Are When you hear the phrase, "God's Perfect Will for your life", what is it you imagine?

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth.

"Rabbi," his disciples asked him, "why was this man born blind? Was it because of his own sins or his parents' sins?"

"It was not because of his sins or his parents' sins," Jesus answered. "This happened so the power of God could be seen in him.

We must quickly carry out the tasks assigned us by the one who sent us. The night is coming, and then no one can work.

But while I am here in the world, I am the light of the world."

Then he spit on the ground, made mud with the saliva, and spread the mud over the blind man's eyes.

John 9:7a He told him, "Go wash yourself in the pool of Siloam" (Siloam means "sent").

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God's Unique Will For You Is As Unique As You Are

When life becomes very hard, unfair, painful, and is full of suffering (especially when the cause or situation is entirely out of your control), it does NOT mean that you are out of God's will or that God's punishing you.

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Blind Jew in 1st Century

- Unjustly judged and incorrectly condemned by society.
- No employment.
- No prospects for marriage.
- No respect, no honor, no love.
- Forced to beg to survive.
- No seeing eye dog, no braille.
- A hopeless situation.

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If you are a faithful believer and follower of Christ (who is not living in outright disobedience), despite your past sins and your past mistakes, you are exactly where you are, exactly when you are, because God's Plans must come to pass.

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"Bad" Terms & Timing

- He was blind and experienced rejection and hopelessness his whole life.
- Jesus put spit filled mud on his eyes instead of healing instantly.
- He was forced to find the pool of Siloam on his own, even though he was blind!

When your life becomes very hard, unfair, painful, or full of suffering (especially when the cause or situation is entirely out of your control)...

It is natural to feel anxious, angry, upset, disappointed, frustrated, or hopeless as you wait on God on to deliver you or as you wait on Him to reveal His unique will for your life.

It is natural to want to angrily compare your walk with God and your blessings from God with those of a fellow brother or sister in Christ who appear to have it way easier than you do.

It is natural to complain about how unfair your life is. It is natural to ask, "Why me God?!" It is natural to think that God's plan for your life sucks! It is natural to want to quit every chance you get.

But if you focus on and invest in having a genuine, intimate, mature relationship with the Lord, the Holy Spirit will supernaturally propel you to keep loving, to keep trusting, to keep obeying, and to keep following God even though you don't understand.

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Brokenness/Anointing

All the different ways we have failed, struggled, suffered, been wounded, or been broken are expressions of our uniqueness in the Kingdom of God, just as they are an expression of our anointing and blessedness.

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Everything that God allows in your life (His permissive will) is allowed to take place because God plans to redeem you and it (His perfect will) for His honor, for His glory, and for His praise.

God's unique will for your life is always about bringing you into right relationship with Him and about partnering with Him to rescue others.
