Principle #1

God created seasons for specific reasons, and to fight against them is to miss out on His purpose and plan.

Genesis 1:14

Then God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night, and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years"

Ecclesiastes 3:1,4 A time to give birth, and a time to die.

A time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance

Ecclesiastes 3:6,7,8

A time to search and a time to give up as lost...

A time to be silent and a time to speak...

A time for war and a time for peace

Principle #4

To receive God's will we must exercise patience, especially in the seasons when we need it the most.

Indeed, none of those who wait for You will be ashamed...

The vision is yet for the appointed time; it hastens towards the goal and it will not fail. If it seems slow, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay.

No better example in the Bible than the story of Joseph

Joseph, when he was seventeen years old, was pasturing the flock with his brothers while he was still a youth, along with the sons of Bilhah and the sons of Zilpah, his father's wives.

Genesis 37:2 And Joseph brought back a bad report about them to their father.

His brothers saw that their father loved him more than all his brothers; and so they hated him and could not speak to him on friendly terms.

Then Joseph had a dream, and when he told it to his brothers, they hated him even more.

Genesis 37:23-24

So it came about, when Joseph reached his brothers, that they stripped Joseph of the multicolored tunic that was on him; and they took him and threw him into the pit.

Then some Midianite traders passed by, so they pulled him up and lifted Joseph out of the pit, and sold him to the Ishmaelites for 20 shekels of silver. Thus they brought Joseph into Egypt.

Principle #2

To understand God's will, we must first discover what season we are in.

Now Joseph had been taken down to Egypt; and Potiphar, an Egyptian officer of Pharaoh, the captain of the bodyguard, bought him from the Ishmaelites, who had taken him down there.

The Lord was with Joseph, so he became a successful man. And he was in the house of his master, the Egyptian.

Now his master saw that the Lord was with him and how the Lord caused all that he did to prosper in his hand. So Joseph found favor in his sight...and all that he owned he put in his charge.

But he refused and said to his master's wife, 'behold, with me here, my master does not concern himself with anything in the house, and he has put all that he owns in my charge.

'There is no one greater in this house than I, and he has withheld nothing from me except you, because you are his wife. How then could I do this great evil and sin against God?'

Now it happened one day that he went into the house to do his work, and none of the men of the household was there inside.

So Joseph's master took him and put him into the jail, the place where the king's prisoners were confined; and he was there in jail.

But the Lord was with Joseph and extended kindness to him, and gave him favor in the sight of the chief jailer.

The chief jailer committed to Joseph's charge all the prisoners who were in the jail; so that whatever was done there, he was responsible for it.

The chief jailer did not supervise anything under Joseph's charge because the Lord was with him; and whatever he did, the Lord made to prosper.

Principle #3

To fulfil God's will, we must embrace our season and not waste a moment of it.

Then they said to him, 'we have had a dream and there is no one to interpret it.' Then Joseph said to them, 'Do not interpretations belong to God? Tell it to me, please.'

Only keep me in mind when it goes well with you, and please do me a kindness by mentioning me to Pharaoh and get me out of this house.

For I was in fact kidnapped from the land of the Hebrews, and even here I have done nothing that they should have put me into the dungeon.

Principle #4

To receive God's will we must exercise patience, especially in the seasons when we need it the most.

Joseph then answered Pharaoh, saying, 'it is not in me; God will give Pharaoh a favorable answer.'

You shall be over my house, and according to your command all my people shall do homage; only in the throne I will be greater than you.

Though I am Pharaoh, yet without your permission no one shall raise his hand or foot in all the land of Egypt.

Now Joseph was thirty years old when he stood before Pharaoh, king of Egypt.

Principle #5

When we finally see what God was doing in our lives, and how He was preparing us to be used by Him, we must glorify His name and tell our story!

Now do not be grieved or angry with yourselves, because you sold me here, for God sent me before you to preserve life.

For the famine has been in the land these two years, and there are still five years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvesting.

God sent me before you to preserve for you a remnant in the earth, and to keep you alive by a great deliverance.

Now, therefore, it was not you who sent me here, but God; and He has made me a father to Pharaoh and lord of all his household and ruler over all the land of Egypt.

Psalm 105:16-17

And He called for a famine upon the land; He broke the whole supply of bread. He sent a man before them, Joseph, who was sold as a slave.

Psalm 105:18-19

They bruised his feet with shackles, his neck was put in a collar of iron; Until what he had said came to pass, the word of the Lord proved (tested) him.

Proof in the Proving

Principle #7

We will see God's complete and perfect will in eternity when we rise as He did, and are tested no more.

Hebrews 11:39

All these were commended through their faith, did not receive what was promised...

1 Corinthians 13:12

For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known.

Nothing but our trials and perils would ever have led some of us to know Him as we do, to trust Him as we have...
