- Mary's and Joseph's reputations are ruined (in their own time) because God blesses them with the privilege of being the parents of the Messiah.
- Mary must live out the difficulties of being pregnant without the pleasure of getting pregnant.

Unfair, Radical Disruptions

- Joseph must live out the difficulties of being a husband and a father without the pleasure of either of them.
- Joseph and pregnant Mary must travel 97.5
 miles from Nazareth to Bethlehem because
 of the greed of the Roman Emperor
 Augustus. (33 hours of walking)

- Road Trip problems
- Pregnancy problems
- Bandit problems
- Weather problems
- Money problems
- Lodging problems
- King of kings is born in a barn

How can we not perceive all of these things as negative?

God's Sovereignty

- God has a plan. Just because you don't know it or can't see it, doesn't mean He doesn't have it.
- God can use any pain, suffering, or brokenness for His ultimate purpose.
- When you choose to partner with God, you will witness and experience miracles.

Partnering with God

- Stop complaining about how unfair the situation is.
- Stop asking God, "Why me?"
- Stop asking God, "How long, O Lord?"
- Count your blessings.
- Get biblical.
- Focus on Holy Spirit led transformation.
