Part 4 Invest in Genuine Connection Not Correction

One night during the second year of his reign, Nebuchadnezzar had such disturbing dreams that he couldn't sleep.



He called in his magicians, enchanters, sorcerers, and astrologers, and he demanded that they tell him what he had dreamed. As they stood before the king,



he said, "I have had a dream that deeply troubles me, and I must know what it means."

Then the astrologers answered the king in Aramaic, "Long live the king! Tell us the dream, and we will tell you what it means."



But the king said to the astrologers, "I am serious about this. If you don't tell me what my dream was and what it means, you will be torn limb from limb, and your houses will be turned into heaps of rubble!



But if you tell me what I dreamed and what the dream means, I will give you many wonderful gifts and honors. Just tell me the dream and what it means!"



They said again, "Please, Your Majesty. Tell us the dream, and we will tell you what it means."

The king replied, "I know what you are doing! You're stalling for time because you know I am serious when I say,

'If you don't tell me the dream, you are doomed.' So you have conspired to tell me lies, hoping I will change my mind. But tell me the dream, and then I'll know that you can tell me what it means."

The astrologers replied to the king, "No one on earth can tell the king his dream! And no king, however great and powerful, has ever asked such a thing of any magician, enchanter, or astrologer!

The king's demand is impossible. No one except the gods can tell you your dream, and they do not live here among people."

The king was furious when he heard this, and he ordered that all the wise men of Babylon be executed.

Daniel went at once to see the king and requested more time to tell the king what the dream meant.

Then Daniel went home and told his friends Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah what had happened.

He urged them to ask the God of heaven to show them his mercy by telling them the secret, so they would not be executed along with the other wise men of Babylon.

That night the secret was revealed to Daniel in a vision. Then Daniel praised the God of heaven.

Arioch quickly took Daniel to the king and said, "I have found one of the captives from Judah who will tell the king the meaning of his dream!"

The king said to Daniel (also known as Belteshazzar), "Is this true? Can you tell me what my dream was and what it means?"

The great God was showing the king what will happen in the future. The dream is true, and its meaning is certain.

The king said to Daniel, "Truly, your God is the greatest of gods, the Lord over kings, a revealer of mysteries, for you have been able to reveal this secret."



Then the king appointed Daniel to a high position and gave him many valuable gifts. He made Daniel ruler over the whole province of Babylon, as well as chief over all his wise men.



At Daniel's request, the king appointed Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego to be in charge of all the affairs of the province of Babylon, while Daniel remained in the king's court.

Daniel wrote his book in both Hebrew and Aramaic. Chapter 1 and chapters 8-12 were written in Hebrew, while chapters 2-7 were written in Aramaic.



Connection creates a solid foundation for conversation.

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We must genuinely connect with those who don't know the Lord so they can experience the supernatural power, love, mercy, grace and forgiveness of God through us.

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Genuine connection is not about correction, it is about having genuine influence on a regular basis.



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Correction without connection breeds rejection.



As daughters and sons of the King, we have a serious responsibility to accurately reflect the Father's heart in the ways we connect and the ways we correct.

- Is it my place to correct this person?
- Do I have a personal relationship and a genuine connection with this person? Or am I being a busybody?

How long have I been in prayer asking God to correct this person **Himself**? Has God told me that it is my

responsibility to correct this person?

How long have I born this burden? Has my patience and long suffering run out? How about God's? Have a diverse group of spiritual elders evaluated my motives?

Has the spirit of self-righteousness and hypocrisy been removed from my heart?

Am I carrying my cross before I pull the trigger on correcting someone?



How would Christ correct this person? How is the Holy Spirit asking me to

correct this person?



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
