Part 6 How to Effectively **Communicate** Caring and Concerned Counsel

So I issued an order calling in all the wise men of Babylon, so they could tell me what my dream meant.

When all the magicians, enchanters, astrologers, and fortune-tellers came in, I told them the dream, but they could not tell me what it meant.



At last Daniel came in before me, and I told him the dream. He was named Belteshazzar after my god, and the spirit of the holy gods is in him.)

I said to him, 'Belteshazzar, chief of the magicians, I know that the spirit of the holy gods is in you and that no mystery is too great for you to solve. Now tell me what my dream means.

Daniel 4:10a While I was lying in my bed, this is what I dreamed.

Daniel 4:18a **Belteshazzar, that was the dream** that I, King Nebuchadnezzar, had. Now tell me what it means, for none of the wise men of my kingdom can do so.

Damiel 4:18b But you can tell me because the spirit of the holy gods is in you.'

Daniel 4:19a Upon hearing this, Daniel (also known as Belteshazzar) was overcome for a time, frightened by the meaning of the dream. Then the king said to him,

Damiel 4:19b 'Belteshazzar, don't be alarmed by the dream and what it means." Belteshazzar replied, 'I wish the events foreshadowed in this dream would happen to your enemies, my lord, and not to you!

Daniel 4:20

The tree you saw was growing very tall and strong, reaching high into the heavens for all the world to see.

It had fresh green leaves and was loaded with fruit for all to eat. Wild animals lived in its shade, and birds nested in its branches.



That tree, your Majesty, is you. For you have grown strong and great; your greatness reaches up to heaven, and your rule to the ends of the earth.



Then you saw a messenger, a holy one, coming down from heaven and saying, "Cut down the tree and destroy it. But leave the stump and the roots in the ground, bound with a band of iron and

bronze and surrounded by tender grass. Let him be drenched with the dew of heaven. Let him live with the animals of the field for seven periods of time.

This is what the dream means, your Majesty, and what the Most High has declared will happen to my lord the king.

Daniel 4:25a You will be driven from human society, and you will live in the fields with the wild animals. You will eat grass like a cow, and you will be drenched with the dew of

heaven. Seven periods of time will pass while you live this way, until you learn that the Most High rules over the kingdoms of the world and gives them to anyone he chooses.

Daniel 4:26

But the stump and roots of the tree were left in the ground. This means that you will receive your kingdom back again when you have learned that heaven rules.

Daniel 4:27a

Therefore, your Majesty, please accept my advice. Renounce your sins by doing what is right, and your wickedness by being kind to the oppressed.

Damiel 4:27b Perhaps then you will continue to prosper.'

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Effectively communicating caring and concerned counsel to others, requires their invitation.

Nebuchadnezzar's History

Twelve months later he was taking a walk on the flat roof of the royal palace in Babylon.



As he looked out across the city, he said, 'Look at this great city of **Babylon!** By my own mighty power, I have built this beautiful city as my royal residence to display my majestic splendor.'

Damiel 4:31

While these words were still in his mouth, a voice called down from heaven, 'O King Nebuchadnezzar, this message is for you! You are no longer ruler of this kingdom.

Damiel 4:32a You will be driven from human society. You will live in the fields with the wild animals, and you will eat grass like a cow.

Damiel 4:32b Seven periods of time will pass while you live this way, until you learn that the Most High rules over the kingdoms of the world and gives them to anyone he chooses."

Daniel 4:33a That same hour the judgment was fulfilled, and Nebuchadnezzar was driven from human society.

Daniel 4:33b

He ate grass like a cow, and he was drenched with the dew of heaven. He lived this way until his hair was as long as eagles' feathers and his nails were like birds' claws.

Nebuchadnezzar's Lessons

 You may have all the power in the world over others, but your power is nothing in comparison to the power of God. You need to stop sinning, and you need to do what is right.

Genuine "Come to Jesus" moments are usually fueled by genuine, redemptive shame.

Genuine redemptive shame is produced as a result of our rebellion and sin before God. It occurs when our sin is exposed before God and, at times, before other people, so that our rejection and shame can propel us into the arms of God.



The goal of effectively communicating caring and concerned counsel to others is their confession, repentance, and redemption.

Damiel 4:34a After this time had passed, I, Nebuchadnezzar, looked up to heaven. My sanity returned, and I praised and worshiped the Most High and honored the one who lives forever.

Daniel 4:34b His rule is everlasting, and his kingdom is eternal.

Damiel 4:35a All the people of the earth are nothing compared to him. He does as he pleases among the angels of heaven and among the people of the earth.

Damiel 4:35b No one can stop him or say to him, What do you mean by doing these things?'

Damiel 4:36 When my sanity returned to me, so did my honor and glory and kingdom. My advisers and nobles sought me out, and I was restored as head of my kingdom, with even greater honor than before.

Now I, Nebuchadnezzar, praise and glorify and honor the King of heaven. All his acts are just and true, and he is able to humble the proud."

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
