Part 6 God Pours Out His Limitless and Shameless Love Freely and Recklessly

Luke 15:11 To illustrate the point further, Jesus told them this story: A man had two sons.

Luke 15:12 The younger son told his father, "I want my share of your estate now before you die." So his father agreed to divide his wealth between his sons.

Luke 15:13 A few days later this younger son packed all his belongings and moved to a distant land, and there he wasted all his money in wild living.

Luke 15:14 About the time his money ran out, a great famine swept over the land, and he began to starve.

Luke 15:15 He persuaded a local farmer to hire him, and the man sent him into his fields to feed the pigs.

Luke 15:16

The young man became so hungry that even the pods he was feeding the pigs looked good to him. But no one gave him anything.

When he finally came to his senses, he said to himself, "At home even the hired servants have food enough to spare, and here I am dying of hunger!

Lulke 15:18 I will go home to my father and say, 'Father, I have sinned against both heaven and you,

Luke 15:19 and I am no longer worthy of being called your son. Please take me on as a hired servant."

Luke 15:20a So he returned home to his father. And while he was still a long way off, his father saw him coming.

Luke 15:20b Filled with love and compassion, he ran to his son, embraced him, and kissed him.

Luke 15:21 His son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against both heaven and you, and I am no longer worthy of being called your son."

Luke 15:22

But his father said to the servants, "Quick! Bring the finest robe in the house and put it on him. Get a ring for his finger and sandals for his feet.

Lulke 15:23 And kill the calf we have been fattening. We must celebrate with a feast,

Luke 15:24 for this son of mine was dead and has now returned to life. He was lost, but now he is found." So the party began.

Lulke 15:25 Meanwhile, the older son was in the fields working. When he returned home, he heard music and dancing in the house,

Luke 15:26 and he asked one of the servants what was going on.

Luke 15:27 "Your brother is back," he was told, "and your father has killed the fattened calf. We are celebrating because of his safe return."

Luke 15:28

The older brother was angry and wouldn't go in. His father came out and begged him, but he replied, "All these years I've slaved for you and never once refused to do a

Lulke 15:29 single thing you told me to. And in all that time you never gave me even one young goat for a feast with my friends.

Luke 15:30 Yet when this son of yours comes back after squandering your money on prostitutes, you celebrate by killing the fattened calf!'

Lulke 15:31 His father said to him, "Look, dear son, you have always stayed by me, and everything I have is yours.

Luke 15:32 We had to celebrate this happy day. For your brother was dead and has come back to life! He was lost, but now he is found!"

Multi-Themed Parable

• This is a parable about God's character and posture. • This is a parable about God's limitless and shameless love. This is a parable about God the **Prodigal Father.**

God's supernatural love for all of His children, saved and lost, is limitless and shameless.

What kind of Father raises children who want their father's possessions more than they want a relationship with their father?

What kind of Father gives his ungrateful and immature children what they want, even though it is clearly wrong and will end in disaster?

What kind of Father runs to his shameful and wayward child demonstrating public affection for all to see when the child has brought such shame on the family?

What kind of Father immediately throws a party for his child who has just returned home with their tail between their legs?

How can the Father even know whether or not his child's words are true? What kind of Father offers the fatted calf to a child who clearly does not deserve it?

What kind of Father publicly begs his child to do as he asks? What kind of Father raises such lost and disrespectful children? If one's not the problem, the other one is!

God's supernatural love for all of His children, saved and lost, is limitless and shameless.

The Lord God is a Prodigal Father.

Prodigal Defined

Spending money or resources freely and recklessly; to be wastefully extravagant.

The Lord God is a Prodigal Father.

God's pure, holy, passionate, perfect, and supernatural love is never wasted regardless of the results.

God is NOT the type of Father that most people assume He is.

Luke 15:1 Tax collectors and other notorious sinners often came to listen to Jesus teach.

Luke 15:2 This made the Pharisees and teachers of religious law complain that he was associating with such sinful people—even eating with them!
