Genesis 37:1 So Jacob settled again in the land of Canaan, where his father had lived as a foreigner.

Genesis 37:2a This is the account of Jacob and his family. When Joseph was seventeen years old, he often tended his father's flocks. He worked for his half brothers,

Genesis 37:2b the sons of his father's wives Bilhah and Zilpah. But Joseph reported to his father some of the bad things his brothers were doing.

Genesis 37:3 Jacob loved Joseph more than any of his other children because Joseph had been born to him in his old age. So one day Jacob had a special gift made for Joseph, a beautiful robe.

Genesis 37:4 But his brothers hated Joseph because their father loved him more than the rest of them. They couldn't say a kind word to him.

Genesis 37:5 One night Joseph had a dream, and when he told his brothers about it, they hated him more than ever.

Genesis 37:12 Soon after this, Joseph's brothers went to pasture their father's flocks at Shechem.

Genesis 37:13 When they had been gone for some time, Jacob said to Joseph, "Your brothers are pasturing the sheep at Shechem. Get ready, and I will send you to them." "I'm ready to go," Joseph replied.

Genesis 37:14a "Go and see how your brothers and the flocks are getting along," Jacob said. "Then come back and bring me a report."

Genesis 37:14b So Jacob sent him on his way, and Joseph traveled to Shechem from their home in the valley of Hebron.

Genesis 37:18 When Joseph's brothers saw him coming, they recognized him in the distance. As he approached, they made plans to kill him.

Genesis 37:19 "Here comes the dreamer!" they said.

Genesis 37:20 "Come on, let's kill him and throw him into one of these cisterns. We can tell our father, 'A wild animal has eaten him.' Then we'll see what becomes of his dreams!"

Genesis 37:21 But when Reuben heard of their scheme, he came to Joseph's rescue. "Let's not kill him," he said.

Genesis 37:22a "Why should we shed any blood? Let's just throw him into this empty cistern here in the wilderness. Then he'll die without our laying a hand on him."

Genesis 37:22b **Reuben was secretly planning** to rescue Joseph and return him to his father.

Genesis 37:23 So when Joseph arrived, his brothers ripped off the beautiful robe he was wearing.

Genesis 37:24 Then they grabbed him and threw him into the cistern. Now the cistern was empty; there was no water in it.

Genesis 37:25a Then, just as they were sitting down to eat, they looked up and saw a caravan of camels in the distance coming toward them.

Genesis 37:25b It was a group of Ishmaelite traders taking a load of gum, balm, and aromatic resin from Gilead down to Egypt.

Genesis 37:26 Judah said to his brothers, "What will we gain by killing our brother? We'd have to cover up the crime.

Genesis 37:27 Instead of hurting him, let's sell him to those Ishmaelite traders. After all, he is our brother our own flesh and blood!" And his brothers agreed.

Genesis 37:28

So when the Ishmaelites, who were Midianite traders, came by, Joseph's brothers pulled him out of the cistern and sold him to them for twenty pieces of silver. And the traders took him to Egypt.

Genesis 37:29 Some time later, Reuben returned to get Joseph out of the cistern. When he discovered that Joseph was missing, he tore his clothes in grief.

Genesis 37:30 Then he went back to his brothers and lamented, "The boy is gone! What will I do now?"

Genesis 37:31 Then the brothers killed a young goat and dipped Joseph's robe in its blood.

Genesis 37:32 They sent the beautiful robe to their father with this message: "Look at what we found. Doesn't this robe belong to your son?"

Genesis 37:33 Their father recognized it immediately. "Yes," he said, "it is my son's robe. A wild animal must have eaten him. Joseph has clearly been torn to pieces!"

Genesis 37:34 Then Jacob tore his clothes and dressed himself in burlap. He mourned deeply for his son for a long time.

Genesis 37:35 His family all tried to comfort him, but he refused to be comforted. "I will go to my grave mourning for my son," he would say, and then he would weep.

Genesis 37:36 Meanwhile, the Midianite traders arrived in Egypt, where they sold Joseph to Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, the king of Egypt. Potiphar was captain of the palace guard.

The Necessary Elements

- The Word of God (the water)
- The presence of the Holy Spirit (the air)
- Love, Forgiveness, Mercy, Grace (the micro-organisms)

The Necessary Elements

 A safe space to take all of the garbage (the compost bin) • A spiritual guide to help you see the events from God's point of view (turning over the pile)

The Necessary Elements

- A spiritual family that will love you through the smelly process (greens and browns)
- Repeat, repeat, and repeat
- Time

- Mother died when he was a child
- He was hated by his half-brothers
- Sold into slavery by his brothers
- Separated from Jacob & Benjamin

Joseph's Life Story

- A slave in Potiphar's household
- Wrongfully imprisoned for doing
 - the right thing
 - Left in prison by the cupbearer
 - Lost 13 years of his life!

Psalm 105:17 God sent a man before them, Joseph, who was sold as a slave.

Psalm 105:18 They bruised his feet with shackles; and placed his neck in an iron collar

Psalm 105:19 Until what he foretold came to pass, until the word of the Lord was fulfilled.

God's promise to work all things together for good for those who love Him and are called according to His purpose does not mean that every situation will be good or that it will have a good result. It also does not mean that we will feel good all the time.

Genesis 45:la Then Joseph could no longer control himself before all his attendants, and he cried out, "Have everyone leave my presence!"

Genesis 45:1b So there was no one with Joseph when he made himself known to his brothers.

Genesis 45:2 And he wept so loudly that the Egyptians heard him, and Pharaoh's household heard about it.

Genesis 45:3 Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph! Is my father still living?" But his brothers were not able to answer him, because they were terrified at his presence.

Genesis 45:4 Then Joseph said to his brothers, "Come close to me." When they had done so, he said, "I am your brother Joseph, the one you sold into Egypt!

Genesis 45:5 And now, do not be distressed and do not be angry with yourselves for selling me here, *because it was* to save lives that God sent me ahead of you.

Genesis 45:6 For two years now there has been

famine in the land, and for the next five years there will be no plowing and reaping.

Genesis 45:7 But God sent me ahead of you to preserve for you a remnant on earth and to save your lives by a great deliverance.

Genesis 45:8 <u>So then, it was not you who sent me</u> here, but God. He made me father to Pharaoh, lord of his entire household and ruler of all Egypt.
