Deliverance Defined God's supernatural activity of rescuing and freeing His children from the oppressive powers of His enemies.

Principle #1

Christ empowered deliverance is derived from genuine, intimate encounters with God and His perfect timing.

Persistent widow pleading her case to the judge (v.1-8) Pharisee and the Tax Collector praying in the Temple (v.9-14)

Luke 18 – Unashamed

Parents who brought their children to Jesus so that He could lay hands on them and pray for them (v.15-17) • The rich ruler who asks how to inherit eternal life (v.18-30)

Luke 18 – Unashamed

Jesus once again tells His disciples that He will be mocked, spit on, whipped, and killed but will rise again! (v.18-30) • After Bartimaeus it is Zacchaeus

$l_{1} \approx 182$ "There was a judge in a certain city," he said, "who neither feared God nor cared about people.

A widow of that city came to him repeatedly, saying, 'Give me justice in this dispute with my enemy.'

$l_{1} \approx 18$ The judge ignored her for a while, but finally he said to himself, 'I don't fear God or care about people,

Lulke 18:5 but this woman is driving me crazy. I'm going to see that she gets justice, because she is wearing me out with her constant requests!"
