Then the Lord told him, "I have certainly seen the oppression of my people in Egypt. I have heard their cries of distress because of their harsh slave drivers. Yes, I am aware of their suffering.

Exodus 3:8a

So I have come down to rescue them from the power of the Egyptians and lead them out of Egypt into their own fertile and spacious land.

Exodus 3:8b

It is a land flowing with milk and honey—the land where the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites, and Jebusites now live.

Look! The cry of the people of Israel has reached me, and I have seen how harshly the Egyptians abuse them.

Now go, for I am sending you to Pharaoh. You must lead my people Israel out of Egypt."

But Moses protested to God, "Who am I to appear before Pharaoh? Who am I to lead the people of Israel out of Egypt?"

God answered, "I will be with you. And this is your sign that I am the one who has sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will worship God at this very mountain."

But Moses protested, "If I go to the people of Israel and tell them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' they will ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what should I tell them?"

God replied to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. Say this to the people of Israel: I AM has sent me to you."

Go, assemble the elders of Israel and say to them, 'The Lord, the God of your fathers—the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob—appeared to me and said:

I have watched over you and have seen what has been done to you in Egypt.

And I have promised to bring you up out of your misery in Egypt into the land of the Canaanites, Hittites, Amorites, Perizzites, Hivites and Jebusites—a land flowing with milk and honey.'

Exodus 3:18a

The elders of Israel will listen to you. Then you and the elders are to go to the king of Egypt and say to him, 'The Lord, the God of the Hebrews, has met with us.

Exodus 3:18b

Let us take a three-day journey into the wilderness to offer sacrifices to the Lord our God.'

But I know that the king of Egypt will not let you go unless a mighty hand compels him.

So I will stretch out my hand and strike the Egyptians with all the wonders that I will perform among them. After that, he will let you go.

And I will make the Egyptians favorably disposed toward this people, so that when you leave you will not go empty-handed.

Every woman is to ask her neighbor and any woman living in her house for articles of silver and gold and for clothing, which you will put on your sons and daughters. And so you will plunder the Egyptians."

But Moses protested again, "What if they won't believe me or listen to me? What if they say, 'The Lord never appeared to you'?"

Then the Lord asked him, "What is that in your hand?"

"A shepherd's staff," Moses replied.

"Throw it down on the ground," the Lord told him. So Moses threw down the staff, and it turned into a snake! Moses jumped back.

Then the Lord told him, "Reach out and grab its tail." So Moses reached out and grabbed it, and it turned back into a shepherd's staff in his hand.

Exodus 4:14a

Exodus 4:14b

I know he speaks well. And look!
He is on his way to meet you now.
He will be delighted to see you.

Talk to him, and put the words in his mouth. I will be with both of you as you speak, and I will instruct you both in what to do.

Aaron will be your spokesman to the people. He will be your mouthpiece, and you will stand in the place of God for him, telling him what to say.

And take your shepherd's staff with you, and use it to perform the miraculous signs I have shown you."

Then Moses went back to Jethro his father-in-law and said to him, "Let me return to my own people in Egypt to see if any of them are still alive." Jethro said, "Go, and I wish you well."

2 Timothy 1:7

For God did not give us a spirit of fear, but of power, love, and self-discipline.

Colossians 1:15

Christ is the visible image of the invisible God. He existed before anything was created and is supreme over all creation, for through him God created everything

Colossians 1:16

in the heavenly realms and on earth. He made the things we can see and the things we can't see— such as thrones, kingdoms, rulers, and authorities in the unseen world.

Ephesiams 6:10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power.

Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes.

The Spirit of Fear Feeds Off of Our Baggage

Baggage Defined

Baggage is a collective term used to describe the emotional, psychological, and spiritual anxieties, burdens, and weights we inevitably carry around with us.

Baggage Desimed

The baggage we carry is usually caused by deeply seeded thoughts, fears, trauma, abuse, rejection, etc. as well as any negative experiences or circumstances from our past.

Exodus 3:13

The Spirit of Fear will always aim to distort the truth of our identity, value, worth, and purpose through our negative past experiences, our present bleak circumstances, and our seemingly dim future.

Without God's intervention, the Spirit of Fear will keep you from receiving God's perfect will or keep you from doing God's will.

The Spirit of Fear wants you to forget the truth of God's Word and His promises.

v.14 "I AM WHO I AM," "tell them I AM has sent me to you." v.15 "Yahweh, the God of your ancestors—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob has sent you to them."

The VICTOR mot Victim

- Even as a killer and a fugitive, he was led to the place where he would gain his family and meet God face to face.
- He learned to shepherd.
