#### John 20:19a

That Sunday evening the disciples were meeting behind locked doors because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders.

#### John 20:19b

Suddenly, Jesus was standing there among them! "Peace be with you," he said.



As he spoke, he showed them the wounds in his hands and his side. They were filled with joy when they saw the Lord!



#### Again he said, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I am sending you."

Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and look at my hands. Put your hand into the wound in my side. Don't doubt any longer. Believe!"

#### The Holy Spirit desires to disinfect, heal, and transform our wounds, so that they don't dominate our hearts or define us.

Our scars help us grow in our faith by sight, while our unhealed wounds help us grow in our faith based on the testimony and the promises of our Master.



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Christ has commissioned us to offer His forgiveness and love to those who are wounded and to those who have wounded us while we are still wounded.



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#### God desires to use our most painful wounds and our ugliest scars to release Christ's allpowerful ministries of acceptance, forgiveness, mercy, grace, healing, and salvation.



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
