God's Restoration in

1 Corinthians 11:17 But in the following instructions, I cannot praise you. For it sounds as if more harm than good is done when you meet together.

1 Corinthians 11:18 First, I hear that there are divisions among you when you meet as a church, and to some extent I believe it.

1 Corinthians 11:19 But, of course, there must be divisions among you so that you who have God's approval will be recognized!

1 Corinthians 11:20 When you meet together, you are not really interested in the Lord's Supper.

1 Corinthians 11:21 For some of you hurry to eat your own meal without sharing with others. As a result, some go hungry while others get drunk.

1 Corinthians 11:22a What? Don't you have your own homes for eating and drinking? Or do you really want to disgrace God's church and shame the poor?

1 Corinthians 11:22b What am I supposed to say? Do you want me to praise you? Well, I certainly will not praise you for this!

l Corinthians 11:23 For I pass on to you what I received from the Lord himself. On the night when he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread

1 Corinthians 11:24 and gave thanks to God for it. Then he broke it in pieces and said, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

1 Corinthians 11:25a In the same way, he took the cup of wine after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant between God and his people -

1 Corinthians 11:25b an agreement confirmed with my blood. Do this in remembrance of me as often as you drink it."

l Corinthians 11:26 For every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are announcing the Lord's death until he comes again.

l Corinthians 11:27 So anyone who eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord unworthily is guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord.

l Corinthians 11:28 That is why you should examine yourself before eating the bread and drinking the cup.

Principle #2

The celebration of Communion is for believers and followers of Jesus Christ who are sinners!

Principle #4

The celebration of Communion is given to us by God to center us in Him through self examination. It is a remedy for sin and spiritual food for the journey of life.

l Corinthians 11:27 So anyone who eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord unworthily is guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord.

l Corinthians 11:28 That is why you should examine yourself before eating the bread and drinking the cup.

1 Corinthians 11:29 For if you eat the bread or drink the cup without honoring the body of Christ, you are eating and drinking God's judgment upon yourself.

Communion Misconceptions

- Can only be performed by certain Christians in a certain office.
 - The Bible gives us a specific "how to" of conducting Communion.

Communion Misconceptions

There is a specific frequency of the celebration that is commanded in the Bible. God wants believers who are in sin or struggling with sin not to take Communion.

Communion Misconceptions

 So long as you don't take Communion, God won't judge you.

Principle #5

When personal and/or corporate sickness and suffering are occurring in the church, we must at least consider the possibility that it could be God's response to lovelessness amongst the brothers and sisters.

1 Corinthians 11:29 For if you eat the bread or drink the cup without honoring the body of Christ, you are eating and drinking God's judgment upon yourself.

1 Corinthians 11:30 That is why many of you are weak and sick and some have even died.

Looking for Lovelessness

- Look Back (Christ's Death)
- Look Forward (Christ's Return)
- Look Up (Fellowship with God)
- Look In (Self Examination)
- Look Around (Fellowship with Other Christians)

Looking for Lovelessness

 Look Out (Loving Others, Strangers, Enemies, Nonbelievers, like Christ has Loved You)

Principle #6

God's judgment on believers in this context is not for the purpose of eternal condemnation, it is for the purpose of DISCIPLINE so that we won't be eternally condemned.

1 Corinthians 11:31 But if we would examine ourselves, we would not be judged by God in this way.

l Corinthians 11:32 Yet when we are judged by the Lord, we are being disciplined so that we will not be condemned along with the world.
