

Part 2 Contagious Commendable Faith

Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.

This is what the ancients, the people in the days of old, were commended for.

By faith we understand that the entire universe was formed at God's command, that what we now see did not come from anything that can be seen.

Rebrews 11:4a By faith Abel brought God a better offering than Cain did. By faith he was commended as righteous, when God spoke well of his offerings.

Hebrews 11:46 And by faith Abel still speaks, even though he is dead.

Hebrews 11:5a By faith Enoch was taken from this life, so that he did not experience death: "He could not be found, because God had taken him away."

Hebrews 11:56 For before he was taken, he was commended as one who pleased God.

And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who earnestly seek him.

Hebrews 11:23 By faith Moses' parents hid him for three months after he was born, because they saw he was no ordinary child, and they were not afraid of the king's edict.

Rebrews 11:24 By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter.

He chose to be mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin.

He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward.

By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the king's anger; he persevered because he saw him who is invisible.

By faith he kept the Passover and the application of blood, so that the destroyer of the firstborn would not touch the firstborn of Israel.

Hebrews 11:29 By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as on dry land; but when the Egyptians tried to do so, they were drowned.

Hebrews 11:30 By faith the walls of Jericho fell, after the army had marched around them for seven days.

By faith the prostitute Rahab, because she welcomed the spies, was not killed with those who were disobedient.

Hebrews 11:32 And what more shall I say? I do not have time to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson and Jephthah, about David and Samuel and the prophets,

Hebrews 11:33 who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, quenched the fury of the flames,

Hebrews 11:34 and escaped the edge of the sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies.

Hebrews 11:35 Women received back their dead, raised to life again. But there were others who were tortured, refusing to be released so that they might gain an even better resurrection.

Hebrews 11:36 Some faced mocking and whipping, and even chains and imprisonment. They were put to death by stoning;

they were sawed in two; they were killed by the sword. They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated—

This world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, living in caves and in holes in the ground.

Hebrews 11:39 These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received all that had been promised by God.

For God had something better in mind for us, so that they would not reach perfection without us.



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Faith Definition

Faith is probably best understood by what it does, more than its definition.

The Facets of Faith

- Believes that God exists.
- **Believes that God has revealed** Himself through the Bible, and that what He has said is true. **Enters into a personal** relationship with God.

The Facets of Faith

- Makes Jesus Christ its Lord and Savior.
 - Believes that God will reward those who exercise true faith.

Misconceptions of Faith

Faith is a life of reflective devotion to any god or any set of beliefs that transforms the individual into a more purposeful, loving person.

Misconceptions of Faith

Faith is predominantly about what facts or doctrines I believe or what things I affirm. Faith is blind. It exists contrary to facts, data, science or medicine.

Misconceptions of Faith

I will have faith in God so long as He is good to me, according to my definition of good. Faith is dependent on one's background, upbringing, and family.
