

Part 9 Contagious Repentance

2 Chronicles 7:11 So Solomon finished the Temple of the Lord, as well as the royal palace. He completed everything he had planned to do in the construction of the Temple and the palace.

2 Chronicles 7:12 Then one night the Lord appeared to Solomon and said, "I have heard your prayer and have chosen this Temple as the place for making sacrifices.

2 Chronicles 7:13 At times I might shut up the heavens so that no rain falls, or command grasshoppers to devour your crops, or send plagues among you.

2 Chronicles 7:14a Then if my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, I will hear from heaven

2 Chronicles 7:14b and I will forgive their sins and restore their land.

2 Chronicles 7:15 My eyes will be open and my ears attentive to every prayer made in this place.

2 Chronicles 7:19 But if you or your descendants abandon me and disobey the decrees and commands I have given you, and if you serve and worship other gods, then I will

2 Chronicles 7:20 uproot the people from this land that I have given them. I will reject this Temple that I have made holy to honor my name. I will make it an object of mockery and ridicule among the nations.

2 Chronicles 7:21 And though this Temple is impressive now, all who pass by will be appalled. They will ask, 'Why did the Lord do such terrible things to this land and to this Temple?'

2 Chronicles 7:22a And the answer will be, 'Because his people abandoned the Lord, the God of their ancestors, who brought them out of Egypt, and they worshiped other gods

2 Chronicles 7:22b instead and bowed down to them. That is why he has brought all these disasters on them."



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Principle #1

Sin is the ultimate cause of suffering, disease, and death for all of God's creation.

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In the same way that God allows humanity to commit evil acts, God also allows the earth to reflect the consequences that sin has had on His creation.

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Blatant sin and outright rebellion will always arouse the Lord's anger, which inevitably brings terrible consequences.

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Principle #4

Genuine confession, coupled with genuine repentance, not only leads to forgiveness and reconciliation with God, sometimes it leads to restoration with others.

Principle #5

Regardless of whatever you have done and despite how long you have done it, it is never too late to be forgiven by God.



We reap what we sow, more than we sow, later than we sow.

Unlike seeds planted in the ground, seeds planted in your life have no exact timetable. Some seeds may sprout and grow quickly, and others may take years to come into bloom.

As it says in Galatians, there is a proper time appointed for the harvest.
