Jesus' Parables

A parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning. Parables tell a story using something we see every day to help us understand a spiritual truth that we cannot comprehend with our natural thinking.

Jesus' Parables

Christ's parables are usually open ended. They are open ended in the sense that we are not told how the story ends. We do not know the final outcome of the situation in the parable.

Jesus Parables

Jesus taught parables that are open ended because they leave the audience with some deep questions to think about. They leave us with a truth to which we have to respond one way or another.

Jesus' Parables

For the most part, Christ's parables are not meant to be prescriptive teaching regarding the details of the earthly story. They are meant to help us understand the spiritual reality that God is revealing to us.

Principle #1

What kind of father immediately throws a party for his child who has just returned home with their tail between their legs?

What kind of father believes his shameful son has changed without any concrete proof for any significant amount of time?

What kind of father goes out of his way to continue to do his best for a child who has only done their worst?

What kind of father begs his child to do what he asks in his own home, especially when company is over?

What kind of father raises such lost and disrespectful children?

If one is not the problem, the other one is!
