- God changed His mind twice about destroying Israel when Moses interceded on their behalf.
- Everyone will no longer be punished for all their sins thanks to the atonement of Jesus Christ.

God can make exceptions to His own rules because there is a difference between the letter of the law and the Spirit of the law.

You have heard the commandment that says, 'You must not commit adultery.'

But I say, anyone who even looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

So if your eye—even your good eye—causes you to lust, gouge it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into hell.

And if your hand—even your stronger hand—causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to be thrown into hell.

God can make exceptions to His own rules because there is a difference between the letter of the law and the spirit of the law.

When the LORD makes an exception to His own rules it is not so that someone can live however they want, but so that they can be free to enter into a right relationship with Him thru faith.

God makes exceptions to His own rules because His love, mercy, grace, and forgiveness are all infinitely greater than the power of sin, evil, or wickedness to pollute, destroy, and kill.

Romans 5:20

God's law was given so that all people could see how sinful they were. But where sin increased, grace increased all the more,

Romans 5:21

so that, just as sin reigned in death, so also grace might reign through righteousness to bring eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

God makes exceptions to His own rules because His love, mercy, grace, and forgiveness are all infinitely greater than the power of sin, evil or wickedness, to pollute, destroy and kill.

God continues to make exceptions to His own rules because He absolutely loves to respond positively whenever and wherever He finds true faith the size of a mustard seed.
