11 Ways

- Be patient.
- Form a genuine connection with the person first.
- Ask questions and listen to their story first.
- Get invited to share your story.

11 Ways

- Invest in sharing your story by organizing and practicing it.
 Focus on:
 - Your life before God
 - Your discovery & decision
 - The difference it made

11 Ways

- Own your story. Be honest, transparent, and vulnerable.
- Keep your story brief and keep them wanting more.
- Remember that your story is about ministering to others.

11 Ways

- Customize your story to your audience.
- Speak plainly and simply.
- Remember that your story is really God's story. He's the hero, not you.
