Colossians 1:15

Christ is the visible image of the invisible God. He existed before anything was created and is supreme over all creation,

Colossians 1:16a for through him God created everything in the heavenly realms and on earth.

Colossians 1:16b

He made the things we can see and the things we can't see—such as thrones, kingdoms, rulers, and authorities in the unseen world. **Everything was created through** him and for him.

Colossians 1:17

He existed before anything else, and he holds all creation together.

Colossians 1:18 Christ is also the head of the church, which is his body. He is the beginning, supreme over all who rise from the dead. So he is first in everything.

Colossians 1:19 For God in all his fullness was pleased to live in Christ,

Colossians 1:20

and through him God reconciled everything to himself. He made peace with everything in heaven and on earth by means of Christ's blood on the cross.

Colossians 1:21

This includes you who were once far away from God. You were his enemies, separated from him by your evil thoughts and actions.

Colossians 1:22a Yet now he has reconciled you to himself through the death of Christ in his physical body.

Colossians 1:22b

As a result, he has brought you into his own presence, and you are holy and blameless as you stand before him without a single fault.

Colossians 1:23a But you must continue to believe this truth and stand firmly in it. Don't drift away from the assurance you received when you heard the **Good News**.

Colossians 1:23b The Good News has been preached all over the world, and I, Paul, have been appointed as God's servant to proclaim it.

Understanding Old Testament Theophanies and the New Testament Cristophany

A Theophanies Purpose

- A God initiated encounter.
- Brings previously unknown, good news or a promise from God.
- Can involve some type of miraculous action or provision.
- Results in greater worship of God

• The Lord appears to Abraham as 3 men in Genesis 18:1-15 • The Lord appeared to Jacob as man, and wrestled him in Genesis 32:24-32. **The Burning Bush in Exodus 3**

The Lord led the Israelites out of Egypt and through the wilderness as a pillar of fire by day and a cloud by night. This was a double theophany in Exodus 13:21-22

- The Angel of the Lord appears to Balaam in Numbers 22:35
 - The Angel of the Lord appears to Manoah and his wife in Judges
 13 (Samson's parents).

The Lord appeared as the fourth man walking around in the furnace with Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, who was as a "son of the gods" in Daniel 3:

Hebrews 1:1

Long ago God spoke many times and in many ways to our ancestors through the prophets.

Hebrews 1:2

And now in these final days, he has spoken to us through his Son. God promised everything to the Son as an inheritance, and through the Son he created the universe.

Hebrews 1:3a

The Son radiates God's own glory and expresses the very character of God, and he sustains everything by the mighty power of his command.

Hebrews 1:3b

When he had cleansed us from our sins, he sat down in the place of honor at the right hand of the majestic God in heaven.

Hebrews 1:4

This shows that the Son is far greater than the angels, just as the name God gave him is greater than their names.

Principle #1

Just believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me. Or at least believe because of the work you have seen me do.
