



Part 3 Understanding Who God Chose to Glorify His ICINCIDINI

Joseph, to whom she was engaged, was a righteous man and did not want to disgrace her publicly, so he decided to break the engagement quietly.

As he considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream.

All of this occurred to fulfill the Lord's message through his prophet:

When Joseph woke up, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded and took Mary as his wife.

But he did not have sexual relations with her until her son was born.

And Joseph named him Jesus.

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Principle #1

The reality of who God is and the reality of who and what He values, all of which can be found in His Word, is usually upside down and backwards in comparison to what many of us believe, value, or think.

What Should Being Blessed and Highly Favored by God Look Like to You?

Blessed and Highly Favored?

- Joseph
- Moses
- David
- Daniel
- Hosea
- Jesus

- Barren and very old (v.7).
- Unanswered prayer for decades (v.13)
- Ridiculed and shamed as a result of not having a child (v.25).
- Zechariah was muted for his unbelief (v.20).

Other Side of the Coim



- Zechariah was a priest who served God throughout his lifetime in the temple (v.5, 8).
- They were both bloodline descendants of the priests of Israel (v.5).

- They were declared righteous in God's eyes, and obeyed all of God's commandments (v.6).
- Zechariah met with an angel who gave him a personal message from God (v.11).

- They were chosen to love and parent God's special messenger, John the Baptist (v.13-17).
- They received a miracle and played an integral part in God's story that we are still talking about today.

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Principle #2

The arrival of God in the flesh on earth was designed to wreck and then correct our understanding of God and His upside down and backwards kingdom.

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Mary

- A nobody from nowhere.
- A lowly servant girl (v.48).
- No credentials or resume.
- Chosen at the worst possible time considering the fact that she was already engaged to Joseph (v.27).

Mary

- She was favored by God (v.28).
- She believes in God's promises (v.38)
- Her heart is full of praise (v.46-55)
- She delights in God's will regardless of the personal cost to her (v.36-56).

More often than not, God's favor rests on ordinary people with ordinary lives who choose to intentionally offer their lives as a living sacrifice to God.

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Principle #3

In God's upside down and backwards kingdom, every one of our lives is a part of a much bigger story. They are a part of God's story.

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Why the Disruption?

- Your life is not about you.
- Refocuses our attention on God.

Sacrificial Obedience

 Mary's and Joseph's reputations are ruined (in their own time) because God blessed them with the privilege of being the parents of the Messiah.


Sacrificial Obedience

- Mary must live out the difficulties of being pregnant without the pleasure of getting pregnant.
