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God only gives us tests and trials that He knows we can pass, because He has prepared us for them.

- When they first meet, Jesus tells Simon that he has a special identity in God's kingdom (John 1:42).
- Jesus Calls Simon to Follow Him after the miraculous catch (Matt. 4:18-22, Mark 1:16-18, Luke 5:1-11).

- Jesus heals Simon's mother-in-law (Mark 1:29-34, Luke 4:38-40)
- Simon walks on water with Jesus (Matt 14:22-36, Mark 6:45-56)
- He affirms Peter's name and that he has heard God directly (Mat 16:13)

- Peter Witnesses Christ's
 Transfiguration (Matt 17:1-13)
- Peter Makes his Foolish Vow (Matt. 26:31-35, Mark 14:27-31, Luke 22:33)
- Christ Prays for Peter's faith not to fail (Lk 22:31-32).

- Peter's Denial (John 18:15-27)
- The Angel's Message (Mark 16:7)
- Resurrected Jesus Appeared to Peter first (among men) (1 Cor. 15:3-8)
- Peter's Re-Test and Reinstatement

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Once you have truly learned, overcome and/or grown from your last setback, God's comeback for your life will often be unlocked by passing a new test, the next test, or a retest.



John 21:15a

After breakfast Jesus asked Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?"

"Yes, Lord," Peter replied, "you know I love you."

John 21:15c

"Then feed my lambs," Jesus told him.

John 21:16a

Jesus repeated the question: "Simon son of John, do you love me?"

"Yes, Lord," Peter said, "you know I love you."

John 21:16c

"Then take care of my sheep,"

Jesus said.

John 21:17a

A third time he asked him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?"

Peter was hurt that Jesus asked the question a third time. He said, "Lord, you know everything. You know that I love you."

John 21:17c

Jesus said, "Then feed my sheep."

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The timing of God's next test or next trial, which you are meant to pass, is usually predicated on coming to the end of yourself.

God blesses you with specific tests and trials that He knows you can pass in order to take you to the next level of your relationship with Him and to the next level of your God Breathed Identity and Destiny.

John 21:18a

"I tell you the truth, when you were young, you were able to do as you liked; you dressed yourself and went wherever you wanted to go.

John 21:18b

But when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and others will dress you and take you where you don't want to go."

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All of God's tests and trials that you pass successfully are never just for you. They are for Him, His Kingdom, and His people also.

God wants to heal and redeem your past because He wants to send you out as a witness, a messenger, and a shepherd who is spiritually and emotionally healthy, fully redeemed, and living free.

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
