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# Part 3 The Baptism of Jesus Christ

## Principle #1

Being baptized is a necessary step of faith because it testifies with our actions that we have confessed and repented of our sins and that we have turned to Christ for God's forgiveness.

#### Luke 3:3

Then John went from place to place on both sides of the Jordan River, preaching that people should be baptized to show that they had repented of their sins and turned to God to be forgiven.

#### Matthew 3:5

People from Jerusalem and from all of Judea and all over the Jordan Valley went out to see and hear John.

#### Matthew 3:6

## Principle #1

Being baptized is a necessary step of faith because it testifies with our actions that we have confessed and repented of our sins and that we have turned to Christ for God's forgiveness.

#### Confession Defined

To admit and believe that God is correct regarding what He says about sin. Confession involves identifying things for what they truly are, which is sin, and honestly acknowledging the offenses we have committed.

### Repentance Desined

Hebrew: a turning of the heart Greek: a change of mind

Genuinely turning away from your sins and turning towards God in a way that is obvious and easy to see.

## Principle #1

## Principle #2

Being baptized is a necessary step of faith because it declares to everyone around you that you have committed yourself to joining Christ in His life, death, burial, and resurrection.

Well then, should we keep on sinning so that God can show us more and more of his wonderful grace?

Of course not! Since we have died to sin, how can we continue to live in it?

Or have you forgotten that when we were joined with Christ Jesus in baptism, we joined him in his death?

For we died and were buried with Christ by baptism. And just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glorious power of the Father, now we also may live new lives.

Since we have been united with him in his death, we will also be raised to life as he was.

#### Romans 6:6

We know that our old sinful selves were crucified with Christ so that sin might lose its power in our lives.

We are no longer slaves to sin.

Just as Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open (schizomenous) and the Spirit descending on him like a dove.

When your baptism is genuine and when you realize that it is only the beginning, then you will be granted access to the blessings and benefits that are now available because through the baptism of Jesus Christ, the heavens have been torn opened.

The most important thing about baptism is not the act of baptism itself, but genuinely turning to God with all your heart, all your mind, all your soul, and all your strength for the forgiveness of your sins.

Being baptized as an act of faith and obedience is a moment marked in time for all of eternity, and while it is a cause for great celebration and joy it is also just the beginning of a life marked by faith and obedience.
